# ATTENDANCE

## ATTENDANCE POINTS ARE BACK!!!

**ZERO TO ONE DAY ABSENT PER NINE WEEKS = FOUR POINTS ADDED TO NINE WEEKS FINAL AVERAGE.**

**- TWO DAYS ABSENT PER NINE WEEKS = THREE POINTS ADDED TO NINE (9) WEEKS FINAL GRADE AVERAGE.**

**- THREE DAYS ABSENT PER NINE WEEKS = TWO POINTS ADDED TO NINE WEEKS FINAL GRADE AVERAGE.**





# TRANSCRIPTS

## GPA

- **OVERALL GPA IS THE CUMULATIVE SCORE OF ALL CLASSES.**
- **A CORE GPA IS THE SCORE OF MATH, SCIENCE, ENGLISH, AND HISTORY.**
- **GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) IS A SCORING AVERAGE BASED ON THE LETTER GRADES MADE EACH SEMESTER. EACH LETTER GRADE IS ASSIGNED A NUMERICAL VALUE.**  
**A=4 POINTS, B=3 POINT, C=2 POINTS, D=1 POINT, F =0 POINTS**
- **TRANSCRIPT REQUEST WILL BE THROUGH THE ONLINE SYSTEM PARCHMENT. I WILL BE SETTING UP THESE ACCOUNTS WITH THEM DURING CLASS PRESENTATIONS THE FIRST WEEK OF SEPTEMBER.**
- **IF YOUR STUDENT NEEDS A COPY OF THEIR TRANSCRIPT OR NEED AN OFFICAL TRANSCRIPT SENT PLEASE HAVE THEM COME AND SEE ME.**

## Credits

- **STUDENTS NEED 50 CREDITS TO GRADUATE FROM ARTESIA HIGH SCHOOL.**  
**EACH CLASS A STUDENT IS TAKING IS WORTH ONE CREDIT PER SEMESTER. STUDENTS SHOULD HAVE 35 CREDITS BY THE END OF THEIR JUNIOR YEAR. IF YOUR STUDENT IS LACKING CREDITS PLEASE COME AND SEE ME, AND WE CAN DISCUSS YOUR STUDENTS PLAN TO GAIN CREDITS BACK.**

# TESTS SENIOR YEAR

- **ACT:** •IS COMPRISED OF 4 TESTS (ENGLISH, MATH, READING, AND SCIENCE) AND AN OPTIONAL WRITING TEST THAT ARE 35-60 MINUTES EACH. THIS TEST IS A REQUIREMENT FOR MANY COLLEGES, ESPECIALLY IN THIS REGION. THIS CAN ALSO HELP US WITH PROFICIENCY FOR GRADUATION.
- **SAT:** •IS COMPRISED OF 10 SECTIONS TESTING OVER CRITICAL READING, MATH, AND WRITING THAT ARE 10-25 MINUTES EACH. THIS TEST IS ALSO USED FOR COLLEGE ADMISSION AND CAN BE USED AS PROFICIENCY FOR GRADUATION.
